

NEW ORLEANS --- At the August 2006 CoB faculty meeting, Dean Harold Doty introduced CoB faculty to Steve Jackson, an accounting professor at Loyola University in New Orleans. Doty informed the CoB that Jackson would be joining USM's School of Accountancy and Information Systems in January of 2007. Doty also stated that Jackson's hire was the result of the CoB's new strategy of raiding New Orleans' higher education community --- a community weakened by the lingering effects of Hurricane Katrina. Finally, Doty suggested that this new strategy might be yielding more fruit for the CoB in the near future.

Since that declaration by Doty in August, usmpride.com investigators have been working off of tips from usmpride.com readers that have led to a number of discoveries. Among these is what is being reported to usmpride.com about the possible future hiring of Kendra Reed, assistant professor of management and MBA director at Loyola University in New Orleans. Second, examination of Doty's own curriculum vitae indicates that Doty and Reed have collaborated in the research area. As the insert below details, they have had a paper published recently by the *Journal of Managerial Issues*.

Reed's publication list at loyno.edu confirms the publication above with Doty.

In terms of funding a line for Reed, any shortfall in the management unit's budget can be more than accounted for by tapping funded salary lines in either Tourism Management or Information Systems. Teaching loads for Carr, Duhon, Gregory and others will be further subdivided should Reed join the USM College of Business. Reed's background also suggests that she might even fill an administrative position in the CoB, either full-time or part-time. Such a move would also add "diversity" to the CoB's directory.
